# Scripture



**Matthew 28 18:20:** Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”

**The first word in the 2nd paragraph is Go:** πορεύω; poreuō; Strong's Number: g4198

The Greek word carries the the following meanings:

1. to lead over, carry over, transfer
2. to pursue the journey on which one has entered, to continue on one's journey
3. to depart from life
4. to follow one, that is: become his adherent
5. to lead or order one's life

*Vines Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words* defines “Go” this way

akin to *poros*, "a passage," in the Middle Voice signifies "to go on one's way, to depart from one place to another." In some places, where the AV\* has the verb "to depart," the RV\* translates by "to go one's way," e.g., **Mat 2:9**, "went their way;" Matthew 11:7; 24:1, "was going on His way."

In the following the RV has the verb "to go," for the AV "depart," Luke 4:42 (latter part of verse); Luke 13:31; John 16:7; Titus 4:10. In Luke 21:8, "go (after)," is said of disciples or partisans. In some places both AV and RV translate by the verb "to depart," e.g., Matthew 19:15; 25:41; Acts 5:41; Acts 22:21. This verb is to be distinguished from others signifying "to go." It is best rendered, as often as possible, "to go on one's way."

\* The King James Bible 1611 AV Eastern [Antioch, Syria and Constantinople aka Byzantine – Eastern Roman Empire] Greek Texts, the actual ancient “Textus Receptus” Greek Bible text documents came to the West (Europe) from Constantinople as a result of the 1453 A.D. fall of Constantinople, or the modern RV Western[Alexandria, Egypt – Sinai, Egypt – Rome] Revised Version [RV] (1881-1885) Greek Texts.
