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## Scripture



**John 3:3-8** Jesus answered and said to him, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a person once grown old be born again? Surely he cannot reenter his mother's womb and be born again, can he?" Jesus answered, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit <sup>(1)</sup>. What is born of flesh is flesh and what is born of spirit is spirit. Do not be amazed that I told you, 'You must be born from above.' The wind blows where it wills, and you can hear the sound it makes, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes; so it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

<sup>(1)</sup> Jesus is talking about the Holy Spirit, and He uses the Greek word  $\pi v \epsilon \tilde{\upsilon} \mu \alpha$  (*pneuma*), which means "a current of air," "breath," or a "breeze"...

Acts 2:1-2 and 4 <sup>1</sup>When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were.

<sup>4</sup>And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

**Ezekiel 37:1-2** The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he led me out in the spirit <sup>(2)</sup> of the LORD and set me in the center of the broad valley. It was filled with bones. He made me walk among them in every direction. So many lay on the surface of the valley! How dry they were!

(2) Ezekiel uses the Hebrew word JIT (rûwach). Strong's definition of JIT is wind; by resemblance breath, i.e. a sensible (or even violent) exhalation; figuratively, life, anger, unsubstantiality; by extension, a region of the sky; by resemblance spirit, but only of a rational being including its expression and functions: air, anger, blast, breath, cool, courage, mind, quarter, side, spiritual, tempest, vain, whirly or windy.

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
