
"Bye Bye Love" was written by Felice and Boudleaux Bryant published in 1957. It is best

known in a debut recording by The Everly Brothers, issued by Cadence Records. The song reached No. 2 on the US Billboard Pop charts and No. 1 on the Cash Box Best Selling Record charts. The Everly Brothers' version also enjoyed major success as a country song, reaching No. 1 in the spring of 1957. The Everly's' "Bye Bye Love" is ranked 210th on Rolling Stone magazine's list of "The 500 Greatest Songs of All
