



Psalm 1 has been called "The Preface Psalm" because in some respects it may be considered "the text upon which the whole of the Psalms make up a divine sermon." It opens with a benediction, "Blessed," as does our Lord's Sermon on the Mount in **Matthew 5:3**.

Scripture and History

Psalm 1: Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.

The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the LORD knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

Psalm 92:12-16 The just shall flourish like the palm tree, shall grow like a cedar of Lebanon. Planted in the house of the LORD, they shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall bear fruit even in old age, they will stay fresh and green, to proclaim: “The LORD is just; my rock, in whom there is no wrong.” (some translation render the last phrase, “there is no unrighteousness in him”.)

"I Shall Not Be Moved" is a traditional American folk song whose lyrics probably stretch back to the slave era, although there is no indication of when the song was written or who wrote it. The song that was adapted by the activists of the 1930s, with lyrics changed to **"We Shall Not Be Moved,"** similarly to how “We Shall Overcome” took on the collective voice in protest rather than its original singular voice.

Typical of many traditional folk songs, the lyrics have been changed through time to apply to the various causes about which the song has been sung. There are versions of this folk song with labor movement and civil rights movement lyrics.
