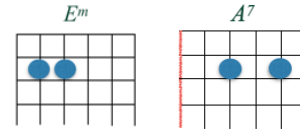

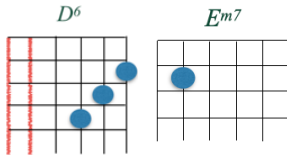

## Scripture and History

**Jesus, Remember Me** is based in **Luke 23:42-43** One of the robbers crucified with the Savior cried out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom". Jesus responded, "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise".

This humble plea of a sinner for divine mercy is all the more poignant today as our Savior in heaven continues to pray for his people.

Jacques Berthier (27 June 1923 to 27 June 1994) was a French composer of liturgical music, best known for writing much of the music used at Taizé.



The Taizé Community is an ecumenical monastic order in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers, from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who originate from about thirty countries across the world. It was founded in 1940 by Brother Roger Schütz, a Reformed Protestant.
